This year's intramurals returned

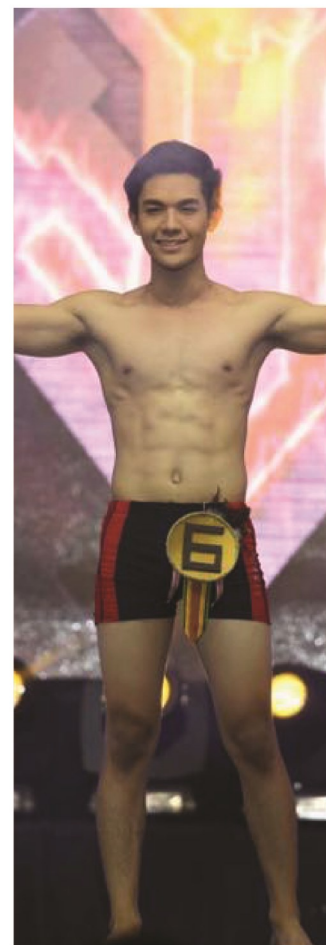
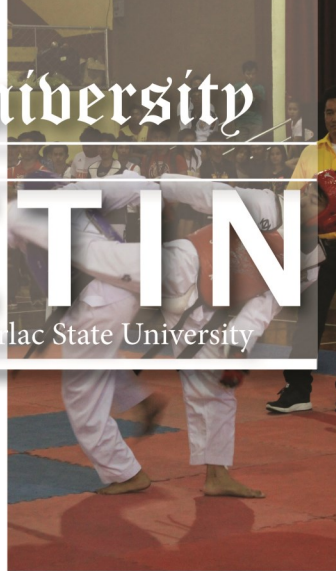
